

# 2020 = \$500,000!

2020 was an extremely difficult year for most of us, and the Covid-19 pandemic inhibited most organized council activities. The pandemic also affected the council's ability to raise funds, which impacted our *direct charitable* donations to organized Faith in Action activities. (Council donations were \$8,900 in 2020—compared to \$20,000 +/- annual donations in each of the last several years). But Covid-19 did not deter the council from meeting its commitment to Faith, Family, Community and Life! In 2020, St. Joseph Council contributed more than one-half million dollars, largely through our brother Knights' personal efforts. For 2020, we established a *record number of hours that members spent in those activities*— *valued at \$493,000!* Add that to the council contributions and we've exceeded *one-half million dollars!* In just one year. The chart tells the story.

The HOURS members devote to activities is far more important than the MONEY the council disburses as contributions. During the 7 years charted, the council disbursed \$135,000 in contributions, but members time was valued at \$1.6 MILLION. And that does not tell the entire story! More members have reported their time each of the last few



years. Yet, even in 2020, <u>sixty</u> members did not submit a Fraternal Activity Survey! It's certain that many did good work, but just didn't share their information with the council.

What we do and telling others is important!

The Value of Members' time is determined by www.independentsector.org/

Volunteers in the United States are 63 million strong and hold up the foundation of civil society. They help their neighbors, serve their communities and faith. They contribute in invaluable ways. The value of their service is based on the average earnings of private sector workers, excluding those who work on farms or in managerial occupations. The value is higher in NJ than most states—\$29.49 in 2019 when the national value was \$27.20.

2020 was an astounding year for our council members' time, talent and treasure generosity!

Thanks to our council Life Activities Director (*at left*), a new "**Choose Life**" banner has been placed on the frame in front of the St. Joseph Parish Rectory. The banner replaces an older banner that we've used for several years.

Brother Rich has monitored the placement of banners on that frame for years, to ensure that we meet the obligations of the Town of High Bridge.

The sturdy aluminum frame is also used annually for the council's **Keep Christ in Christmas** banner. (The frame was donated several years ago by St. Joseph parishioner George Mehaffey and erected by brothers Wayne McKay, Greg Boyle and parishioner Frank Gregory. Mehaffey, McKay and Boyle also teamed up to erect the frames on the front of St. Joseph Church used for seasonal banners and parish information.)

The new sign promotes the Life Choices Medical facility in Phillipsburg that provides critical support to pregnant women (examples below) and operates a mobile Women's Health Center.
