

On Saturday, October 28, Fr. Kris Kaczynski

will be installed as Pastor of St. Joseph Parish at the 4 pm Vigil Mass. Immediately after, he will travel to St. John Neumann Church to be installed as Pastor at the 5:30 pm Mass.



(From the St. Joseph Church website:)

"Fr. Kris Kaczynski was born in 1964 in Poland. After grammar and high school, he attended the Pontifical Academy of Theology in Krakow and earned a Doctor of Theology.

In 1988, Fr. Kris became a Missionary in Africa and served in Zambia. He was ordained in 1993. Fr. Kris moved to Nairobi, Kenya* and lectured Theology of the Church and Theology of Peace at Tangaza College, Catholic University of Eastern Africa and ministered at UN Refugee Camp.

After moving to United States in 2000 he ministered in New York. In 2002 he joined the Diocese of Metuchen and ministered at Immaculate Conception Church in Annandale. In 2009 he became pastor of St. Edward the Confessor Parish in Milford and in 2012 of Our Lady of Victories Parish in Baptistown."

* Fr. Kris becomes the second priest having ties to Africa to guide St. Joseph Council!

For several years, Father Frederick Otieno Nyanguf

was our council Chaplain after joining the Knights of Columbus in St. Joseph Council. At the time, Fr. Fred was a priest in the Apostles of Jesus order, assigned to the Blue Army Shrine in Washington, NJ.



As our council Chaplain, Fr. Fred was active in council affairs and provided spiritual guidance to members. He later returned "home" to Nairobi, Kenya, where he then served at their major seminary in Nairobi. Fr. Fred has since been involved in the Tembea Youth Centre for Sustainable Development (TEMBEA) in Nairobi.

"Halloween" has ancient roots in a cave!

Nestled away in a field in Rath Croghan, County Roscommon, is *Oweyganat*

Cave, Ireland's "entrance to the Otherworld."

Many believe the cave is the birthplace of the pre-Christian festival *Sam*-



hain (pr. 'sah win'), that marks the end of the harvest season and beginning of winter.

Early Christians believed that a gate opened on that date every year, allowing the



ghosts of the dead to return to earth. The pagan tradition was brought to America by

the Irish in the 19th century as Halloween—October 31.

In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as a time to honor all saints and *All Saints Day* incorporated some

of the traditions of Samhain. Pope Gregory IV later extended this celebration of all saints




to the universal church and the evening before became known as All Hallows Eve—later, "Halloween".

Over time, Halloween has evolved into a day of activities with trick-ortreating, carving jack-o-lanterns, festive gatherings, donning costumes and eating treats.

Just before the school year started, he injured his back.


He was required to wear a plaster cast around the upper part of his body. Fortunately, the cast fit under his shirt and wasn't noticeable.
