This is another critical program that our Council participates in every year to provide much needed warm coats for the upcoming winter season for those children who are in need.

Veteran's Day is November 11th. I would like to thank all veterans for the sacrifices that they have made. Our country would not be as great as it is without their sacrifices and the sacrifices of their families. Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Eisenhower signed legislation changing the name to Veterans Day to honor all those who served their country during war or peacetime. I encourage everyone to take some time to thank a veteran on this day and everyday as many of our

veterans need our support and prayers after coming home from service and foreign wars. We continue to pray for our veterans and current military personnel.

THANKSGIVING FOR THE LIVING AND THE DEPARTED

Dear Friends,

Many have already made (some are still making) plans for **Thanksgiving Day** – that quintessential American celebration of Family union and Family meal. The concept of thanksgiving undergirds another month-long celebration: Remembering the departed souls.

Is there life beyond death? Most religions and cultures around the world believe there is. Many festivals worldwide celebrate a time when the dead return to mingle with the living. The Hindus call it a night of Holi. The Iroquois Native Americans celebrate a feast of the dead every 12 years, when all those who have died during the preceding 12 years are honored with prayers. A national holiday in Mexico, the Day of the Dead, begins on November 2 and lasts several days. In this gruesome festival, death becomes a kind of neighborly figure, appearing on candy, jewelry, toys, bread, cakes, and so on. This is the time when the souls of the dead return and when the living are to honor them. For example, doors are decorated with flowers to welcome the angelitos, the souls of dead children.

We Catholics certainly believe in the afterlife. The Catholic Church has designated the month of November to remember all our departed near and dear ones. This is the traditional time to visit the graves of loved ones, as is the anniversary of their deaths.

We really think about, cherish and remember our loved ones who are departed from earth. Offering prayers help us to thank God for the blessing of their lives in which we too shared. Autumn offers us a perfect metaphor of aging and dying. We see the trees shine like rainbows in September and October and then the leaves pass away and the tree trunks and branches are shellacked black by chilly rains. All these will remind us about the reality of our own death – a topic we rather not think about!

Bible often calls death with a very pleasant term 'sleep' and even Jesus used that term regarding his friend Lazarus who actually had died. See John 11:11-14. St. Paul spoke about those who are alive and those who are asleep (referring to the dead) in 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17. Yes we don't need to be afraid of death because Jesus conquered death through his resurrection. It is a guarantee for us to think of death as a passage to the life of eternity, to join the "communion of saints" a doctrine that reminds us of rejoining with our dear departed ones who are with God.

So, as we celebrate Thanksgiving, may it not be a one day celebration for the living, but let us offer thanksgiving for the departed ones who were part and parcel of our lives, and we pray for their eternal rest and joy with God.





Phil obtained Perpetual Mass Cards for each deceased member and enrolled them. He then worked with the council's Faith Director, Andrew Rispoli, to mail or deliver the cards to the families of the deceased members. (Finding relatives of some deceased members required a lot of effort!)

Brother Phil (who has a strong devotion for the Souls in Purgatory) reminds us, "Those who are in Purgatory will not forget us they will intercede for us in our most trying times."

Phil has also initiated monthly Masses to be said for the families of all living and deceased Knights. The first such


Mass was at St. Joseph Church on September 17 and the first at St. John Neumann Church was Oc-













tober 22. Masses are also scheduled at St John Neumann Church on November 25th at 5:30 pm and December 24th at 10:30 pm. (Once the Mass books are open at St Joseph Church he'll schedule masses there.)

The Church dedicates the entire month of November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory and we are encouraged to pray for the souls of the faithful departed, especially those whom we have known and loved. (November 2nd is All Souls Day.) The Church teaches us, "Prayers for the faithful departed pleases God, who makes use of our prayers to help purify these souls that He loves. It is an act of charity that we can give for those we have known and loved, for our ancestors who gave us life, for those who were our benefactors, for those whose memory is lost, and for those who have no one else to pray for them." We do so whenever we recite the Apostles Creed when we pray, "...I believe in the ... the communion of saints ..."



For more than 20 years, St. Joseph Council members have supported the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Clinton (formerly in High Bridge). We do so now under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus Food for Families program.

The council efforts, headed up by brother Don Branflick, includes volunteer work at the pantry helping clients. Don also manages the efforts of volunteers who, on Tuesday & Thursday mornings, pick scratch and dent, bakery items, and other food donations from ShopRite in Clinton and transport them to the food pantry. Over the years, we've transported move MANY TONS of food to be distributed

to needy families.

The amount of the available food has increased lately and more volunteers are needed.

Who's afraid of Alzheimer's?



In the following analysis, the French Professor Bruno Dubois Director of the Institute of Memory and Alzheimer's Disease (IMMA) at La Pitié-Salpêtrière - Paris Hospitals, addresses the subject in a rather reassuring way:

"For some time now, I have been stuck and I do not know what we were talking about ...Before, I was afraid it was the beginning of Alzheimer's ... but today, after reading this article, I am reassured."

"If anyone is aware of his memory problems, he does not have Alzheimer's."

- 1. I forget the names of families ...
- 2. I do not remember where I put some things ...

It often happens in people 60 years and older that they complain that they lack memory. *The information*

is always in the brain, it is the 'processor' that is lacking.

This is "ANOGNOSIA" or temporary forgetfulness.

Half of people 60 and older have some symptoms that are due to age Rather than disease. The most common cases are:

- forgetting the name of a person,
- going to a room in the house and not remembering why we were going there,
- a blank memory for a movie title or actor, an actress,
- a waste of time searching where we left our glasses or keys.

After 60 years most people have such a difficulty, which indicates that \Box it is not a disease but rather a characteristic due to the passage of years.

Many people are concerned about these oversights hence the importance of the following statements:

"Those who are conscious of being forgetful have no serious problem of memory.

"Those who suffer from a memory illness or Alzheimer's, are not aware of what is happening."

Professor Bruno Dubois, Director of IMMA, reassures the majority of people concerned about their oversights: *"The more we complain about memory loss, the less likely we are to suffer from memory sickness."*

Now for a little neurological test: ONLY USE YOUR EYES!





Three winners of our 2023 High Bridge Soccer Challenge event won their brackets at the Metuchen Regionals and will now advance to State Cup on November 4.


- 11 year old boy Mason Meijer
