The Knights have just reached a big milestone by delivering 1 million coats since the program started. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly was on hand in Denver on November 6th to help distribute 1,000 coats and celebrate this milestone by delivering the one millionth coat.

On November 4th, the State Soccer Challenge took place in Ewing, NJ. Liam Rogan (son of brother Sean Rogan) became a state champion for the third time by winning the 12-year-old boys' category. He is also a previous international champion. Congratulations to Liam and the Rogan family!

The council also had a "Thanksgiving for the Needy" collection over the weekend of November 11 and 12th at St. Joseph's Church. All proceeds benefited the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Clinton. Thank you for all your generous donations.

Now that December is upon us, things will start to get very busy as we decorate our homes, buy gifts, and prepare for Christmas. Advent starts on December 3rd. Advent is a season of preparation as we wait for Our Lord's return and to celebrate His birthday on Christmas. There is a lot happening at our parishes throughout the month. 

Avoid Spoofing Scams

Phone scammers often disguise their identity by using illegal spoofing techniques to send false information to your caller ID display. To trick you into answering, spoofers may use local area codes and numbers that look familiar. Or they may impersonate a company you do business with, such as a local utility, or even a government agency.

Here are some good ways to avoid being spoofed:


- Don't answer calls from unknown numbers.
- If you answer and it's not who you expected, don't hang on, hang up.
- If a caller asks you to hit a button to stop getting calls, just hang up.
- Never assume an unexpected call is legitimate. Hang up and call back using a number you can verify on a bill, a statement, or an official website.
- Be suspicious. Con artists can be very convincing: They may ask innocuous questions, or sound threatening, or sometimes seem too good to be true.
- Don't give out personal information account numbers, Social Security numbers or passwords or answer security questions.
- Use extreme caution if you are being pressured for immediate payment.
- Ask your phone company about call blocking tools for landlines or apps for mobile devices.
- Report spoofing scams to law enforcement, the FCC and the FTC.

Since 2009, over one million kids have been provided a warm winter coat due to the Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids program. St. Joseph Council purchases and distributes coats annually to have them distributed to children by Life Choices in Phillipsburg.

Many councils that cannot directly support local programs raise funds and donate them through Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., so that those funds can help purchase coats and distribute them where they are needed most. The funds raised also help to keep the overall cost of coats down so that council efforts can go further.

Notes: (a) from 1992 through 2003 and since 2011 collections were by the St. Joseph Council; 2004 through 2010 collections were a joint effort of the St. Joseph Council & Immaculate Conception Council; (b) beginning in 2007, St. Joseph Church parishioners have also contributed via an annual collection taken by the Knights; (c) Shop-Rite collections began in 1992; Walmart was added from 1999 to 2010 (until the landlord stopped allowing charitable collections). (d) Prior to 2014 all collections were Friday through Sunday. Beginning in 2014 Shop-Rite began limiting collections to Saturdays & Sundays by the St. Joseph Council. (e) Covid-19 interrupted the project from 2020-2022 but we were able to resume Shop-Rite collections and council contributions in 2023.
