On December 6th, Food for Families Activity Leader, Don Branflick, arranged along with St. Joseph Church Parish Business Administrator, Mary-Jean Fiore, and me to deliver ShopRite gift cards to the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Clinton. The total value of the cards is \$2,900 that they hand out to clients of the food pantry as needed. Thank you to Don and all the brother Knights who give their time at ShopRite picking up the food and at the food pantry.

Also on December 12th, Warden Jim Codd, Mary-Jean Fiore, Anne McGovern, George Mehaffey, and I brought the Jesse Tree gifts that were collected at St. Joseph Church to Veterans Haven North in Glen Gardner. We had three full cars and some gifts in a fourth car to bring to the veterans. The staff and residents that we met there were very grateful and extend their thanks to all of those who donated to help them. As a reminder, if anyone might have missed the opportunity to provide a gift to that facility, you can always drop off needed items during their regular business hours. They appreciate donations anytime of the year. We thank those veterans and the staff there for their past and continued service.

On December 14th, Treasurer, Rich Mirocco, his wife Linda, and Mary-Jean Fiore delivered the Jesse Tree gifts collected at St. Joseph Church to Life Choices in Philipsburg. Life Choices extends their thanks for the gifts donated. As with the veterans, Life Choices also accepts donations any time of year during regular business hours. The staff there are doing great work helping some of the most vulnerable in our community. We thank them for their continued service.

At the December 14th Council Meeting, FS Andrew Rispoli and I recognized two members (one was present) who have now obtained Honorary Life Membership in the Knights of Columbus. My father, Ron Dietrich and PGK Kenneth D. Brown are now Honorary Life Members. Congratulations to both brother Knights and thank you for your service to the Council.

The Council also received thanks and gratitude from our Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly, in the form of a letter from our participation in the K of C Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) Program.

A big thank you to our Life Director, Rich Mirocco and our FS Andrew Rispoli for doing the work to have us involved in this great program helping to support Life Choices in Phillipsburg. If you would like to participate in a march locally, there will be a Mass for Life at St. James Church in Woodbridge the morning of the 19th which is typically followed by a procession to the abortion facility which is one block away from the Church. Bishop Checchio led the procession last year and the rosary was prayed outside of the facility. The first ever New Jersey March for Life will take place on September 26th. It is a long way off, but still good to note this important date now. Life Director, Rich Mirocco, will have more information on these events as it becomes available.

On January 26th, Family Director, Joe Gallico, is planning to have Pizza on the Knights. This is a Friday night event geared towards Knights and their families. This gives us an opportunity to get brother Knights together, have some pizza, and spend some time together. Jesse Trees are a Christmas tradition that began in medieval times. The name was derived from Jesse, the father of the great Jewish King David. While the secular world focused more and more on Santa, presents, and treats, in Christian communities, the Jesse Tree is intended to remind us about Jesus—the real meaning of why we celebrate Christmas. During many Advent seasons, Jesse Trees were placed in the vestibule of St. Joseph Church by the former parish Altar-Rosary Society and later, by St. Joseph Council. Hundreds of gifts

were gathered and distributed to local families and others.
