Fred Joseph Levasseur, 78, of Glen Gardner, died Tuesday, Jan. 21, 2003 at the Rolling Hills Care Center in Clinton Township.

Mr. Levasseur was born Sept. 17, 1924 in Van Buren, Maine, the son of the late Simon and Gladys Leveque Levasseur.

He had lived in Glen Gardner for 43 years.

He was a chef for the former Kirk's Diner in Clinton. Many years ago, he had also worked for the Bangor-Aroostook Railroad in Maine.

Mr. Levasseur was a member of the No. 472 Labor's Union in Newark. A veteran of World War II, he served as corporal with the Marine Corps from 1943 to 1945 and participated in the invasion of Iwo Jima.

He was a member of Immaculate Conception Church in the Annandale section of Clinton Township and the High Bridge Knights of Columbus. He was also a member of the Glen Gardner V.F.W.

Survivors include his wife, Mildred Page Levasseur; two sons, Milton of Glen Gardner and Victor of Union Township; two daughters, Carol Sciacca of High Bridge and Rebecca Gromlowitz of Hampton; two sisters and nine grandchildren. He was predeceased by two brothers.

A funeral mass was held on Friday, Jan. 24, at the Immaculate Conception Church, Old Allerton Road, Annandale. Interment was in Evergreen Cemetery, Clinton.
