

Obituaries: Terry Macko, retired teacher and administrator in North Hunterdon-Voorhees High School District, dies at 64

CLINTON TWP. — Terry A. Macko passed away Thursday, Aug. 25, 2011, at Hunterdon Medical Center. He was 64.

He was born on Nov. 27, 1946 in Elizabeth and was a resident of Clinton Township for the past 41 years. He was the son of Teofil and Honorata (Novinski) Macko.

Terry was a graduate of Rider College, receiving his B.S. degree in business education in 1968 and his master's in supervision and instruction in 1973. Terry was employed by the North Hunterdon/Voorhees Regional High School District for 38 years.

During those years, he was a business education teacher, assistant principal for student activities and supervisor of practical arts. After retiring from education, he worked as a staff accountant at Bonnie Brae Residential Treatment Center in Liberty Corner.

Terry served on the New Jersey State Board of Certification and Academic Credentials and was a member of the Advisory Committee for Graduate Programs in Business Education at Rider College. He was a member of Middle States Evaluation Teams for North Brunswick Township High School, Roxbury High School and East Rutherford High School.

Educational memberships included the North Hunterdon/Voorhees High School District Supervisor's Association, New Jersey Principal & Supervisor's Association, National Association of Secondary School Principals and Supervisors and the New Jersey School Boards Association.

Terry was a charter member of St. Joseph's Council 10627 of the Knights of Columbus in High Bridge, serving as treasurer, financial secretary, deputy grand knight and past grand knight. He was purser and former faithful comptroller of the George Washington Assembly 653 of the Knights of Columbus in Somerville. He was also a charter member of the newly formed Pope John Paul II Assembly 3293 of the Knights of Columbus, serving as faithful captain and color corps commander.

Terry was an usher, Eucharistic minister and Finance Committee member at St. Joseph's Church in High Bridge. He volunteered at both Bonnie Brae and the Hunterdon Medical Center. Terry was a 10-gallon donor at the Hunterdon Medical Center Blood Bank. He was a former member of the Clinton First Aid & Rescue Squad. And he served as a member of the Clinton Township Board of Education from 1978 to 1985.

Survivors include his wife of 43 years Marie (Ford) Macko; daughters Suzanne and her husband David C. Majercak of Stewartsville and Christine and her husband James Shickora of Flemington; and grandchildren David, Megan, Katie, and Lance Majercak and Michael and Amanda Shickora.
